Sing to the Lord with Bob Batastini

The next Meeting of the Pittsburgh Chapter NPM will be Tuesday, May 5, at St. Margaret Mary Church in Moon Township. Our host will be Brenden Griffey. For Google and Mapquest purposes the address of the church is 1 Parish Place, Coraopolis PA 15108.

Robert J. Batastini is the retired vice president and senior editor for GIA Publications, Inc., Chicago. Though retired from management, he maintains an active role at GIA. Bob has over fifty years of service in pastoral music ministry, having served several parishes in the Archdiocese of Chicago and one in the Diocese of Joliet. He is now director of music emeritus for St. Joseph Parish in Downers Grove, Illinois. He served as executive editor and project director for the Worship hymnals (three editions), Gather hymnals (three editions), Catholic Community Hymnal, and as executive editor of RitualSong.



In 1993 he became the first recipient of the Father Lawrence Heimann Citation for lifetime contribution to church music and liturgy in the U.S., awarded by St. Joseph's College, Rensselaer, Indiana, and was named "Pastoral Musician of the Year-2000" by the National Association of Pastoral Musicians (NPM). At its 2006 conference, he was named a Fellow of the Hymn society in the United States and Canada.

Bob is a thirty year member of the North American Academy of Liturgy, past-president of the Hymn Society in the United States and Canada, served as a member of the Council for the National Association of Pastoral Musicians, and currently is a member of the Music Advisory Committee of the Bishops Committee on the Liturgy.

Bob will discuss how this latest document of the USCCB on music and the liturgy affects parish musician and Sunday worship.

Koinonia includes all the actions that make and build community or an assembly. Animator is a term used to describe a person who enlivens, gets things done, and causes things to happen. This from the diocese. A revision of the salary guidelines as outlined in the musicians hiring procedures.

NOTES REGARDING DETERMINATION OF YEARLY SALARY AMOUNT

After the initial placement, salary advancement is determined by reviewing the job responsibilities according to the Job Evaluation Form. The specific salary amount is reflective of mutual dialogue and agreement on the part of the pastor/administrator and minister.

The quality of the work, over and above the quantification of factor points, is also taken into consideration. This allows for acknowledgement of exceptional performance in program administration as well as local and/or national recognition for excellence.

If, in any given year, the determination of the total number of points causes the classification level to advance a level from the preceding year, it is suggested that the starting salary on the new level be determined by retaining the figure of the maximum amount offered on the lower level plus the current percentage of the cost of living.

Example: Mrs. Smith's annual review results in an increase of total points from 74 in 2008 to 89 in 2009. Thus, she moves from Level 2 to Level 3. Her 2008 salary was \$25,000 and her 2009 salary will be \$35,178.78. Maximum on the current Level 2 is \$34,489 + cost of living for 2009 2% = salary (\$34,489 + \$689.78 = \$35,178.78).

If, in any given year, the determination of the total number of points does not advance from the preceding year, or advances only minimally, it is suggested that the salary figure of the preceding year be retained plus the current percentage of the cost of living.

Example: Mrs. Smith's annual review results in a minimal increase from 74 in 2008 to 76 in 2009. This minimal increase does not warrant any advancement. Her 2008 salary was \$25,000 and her 2009 salary will be \$25,500. Current salary + cost of living for 2009 2% = salary (\$25,000 + \$500 = \$25,500).
